





Come to APAM 2018 to see new Australian and New Zealand tour-ready productions across dance, theatre, circus and more in beautiful Queensland, Australia!

Held 19 - 23 February 2018 in Brisbane, Queensland - the Australian Performing Arts Market (APAM) is Australia's largest internationally focused industry showcase event for contemporary performing arts.

Brisbane Powerhouse Artistic Director Kris Stewart said APAM is a must-see event for national and international industry, festivals and venues interested in touring the very best Australian and New Zealand productions.

"Over five days and across five venues APAM brings together over 1,200 influential Directors, Executives, Creatives, Associate Producers, CEOs, General and Program Managers, Artists and Agents from around Australia and the globe. It is a unique opportunity to discuss the latest ideas and innovations across performing arts in Australia, while discovering new Australian talent," said Mr Grybowski.

The Premier and Minister for the Arts Annastacia Palaszczuk said Brisbane will again be the place to be when APAM takes centre stage next year.

"I am delighted to welcome delegates from around the world to Queensland for the highly anticipated APAM 2018. APAM is about the business of the performing arts and provides career changing opportunities for artists and arts companies.

"Attended by more than 650 national and international delegates together with 250 participating artists, this event reinforces Queensland's reputation as a premier arts and cultural destination.

"I am thrilled six Queensland artists and companies have been selected to pitch in APAM 2018, including Bleached Arts, Casus Circus, Dancenorth Australia, Leah Shelton, Queensland Theatre and Thomas E Kelly.

In addition APAM will also host events celebrating First Nations Performing Arts with capacity building, exchange and showcase opportunities for artists from Australia, New Zealand and Canada.















Queensland Tourism and Major Events Minister Kate Jones said APAM was a great contemporary arts experience which showcased Brisbane's cultural scene.

"We look forward to welcoming hundreds of performing artists and organisations from across Australia and New Zealand to this event and to experience the unique tourism opportunities on offer in Brisbane" Ms Jones said.

APAM 2018 coincides with other major international arts festivals in Australia and across the Asia Pacific region. These include Perth International Arts Festival 9 Feb -4 Mar, New Zealand Festival - 23 Feb - 18 Mar, Adelaide Fringe and Adelaide Festival - 2 - 18 Mar. The timing of the event makes it a unique opportunity for international travellers.

APAM 2018 will be presented by leading performing arts venue Brisbane Powerhouse with additional events held across local partner venues including the Queensland Performing Arts Centre and Sofitel Brisbane Central.
